Make-up of 780 Relay Doubtful
In the 780, the make-up of the team is still in doubt. If the 390 comes early in the evening and the 780 fairly late, Bawden and Bardes will be used again if they are in condition. The other two men who will complete the team are W. J. Hennessey '21 and T. H. Gill '21. It is quite unlikely that Bawden and Bardes will be used and the third and fourth men will be C. L. Stone '21 and W. B. Gurney '22 with H. C. Stephens '20 in reserve. These positions had not been decided till late Wednesday afternoon, when the second trials for the relay were completed. The positions that the men will take in the race have not been decided as yet.

The freshmen team which will run the Dartmouth and Holy Cross cubs is made up of A. R. Holden, R. P. Bolster, E. D. Demming and W. L. West. They will run in the order named. Holden has been unable to train lately on account of sickness and it is doubtful whether he will be able to stand the pace and may be taken out. A. D. Smith will fill his place. West is new at the running game but has great possibilities. Bolster was captain of the freshman Field Day team. Holden is also inexperienced. Demming has done a little track work. Kanaly says that he thinks this is the best freshman team that has been turned out by the Institute.

MacMahon Entered in Three Mile
In the invitation 40-yard dash, Technology is represented by T. Bosert '21 and A. G. Hayes '22. Bosert did not run last year, but won his T in 1918. Hayes is a newcomer in track circles. Poole, Downey and Bawden will run the 660. Hennessey, H. F. Brennan '23, R. G. MacDonald '22 and F. H. Plaisted '23 will work in the 1000-yard run. Henry Pierce '20, captain of last year's team and E. A. Merrill '21 will wear the Institute's colors in the high jump. J. O. Merrill '21 is entered in the hurdles. Bill MacMahon, Technology's stellar performer in the longer runs and

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captain-elect of next year's bill-and-dalers will run in the special event of the evening, the three-mile scratch run. MacMahon has placed well up at the front in all college competitions this season but will be forced to the utmost to win a place against the group of well-known athletes who have entered this event. Among the entries will be found Charlie Pores, Max Bohland, Fred Faller and Gordon Nightingale.
E. E. Sanborn '22 is ready for the mile. Sanborn is a greenhorn who has made such rapid progress since last fall that he is expected to do things in the Spring. This is his first open competition.
