Senior Banquet Wednesday

The next event on the program is the Senior Banquet which takes place at the Boston City Club on Wednesday evening June 9 at 6.30 o'clock. As several members of the class have been in doubt as to the dress at the dinner, the committee in charge has announced that the dinner is an informal one. Entertainment will be furnished during the course of the evening and prominent men about the Institute as well as Boston are to speak, but as yet the committee wishes to keep their names a secret.

The Senior Frolic or as it is otherwise known as the Senior Class Day occurs the next day, Thursday, June 10, at Walker Memorial. The actual exercises do not start until 2 o'clock, but the members of the Senior Class have been requested to meet in the gymnasium at 1.45 so as to arrange the various banners and costumes that will be exhibited at the frolic. After the Class Day exercises there will be held receptions by the department heads at the headquarters of each course.

Sheep Skins Given Friday

On the evening of the same day, the Senior Dance, or as it is called by some the Senior Prom, is held at Walker at 8.30 o'clock. Again the committee wishes to impress upon the persons who attend that the dance will not be in evening dress for the men but will be considered to have the "uniform of the day" white flannels. Ladies will wear the usual evening dress. Refreshments will be served during the course of the evening.

The sheep skins will be presented to all who have successfully passed the required tests and examinations at the graduation exercises on Friday, June 11, in Walker Memorial at 2.30 o'clock, but once again the graduating students are asked by the men in charge to meet in the gymnasium at 1.45 o'clock. This is considered the most serious event of the four years of undergraduate days. At the close of the exercises, the Presidents reception is scheduled but the place where this will take place has not yet been announced.

Pops Concert at Symphony Hall

The final event of the week is the Pops Concert on the same night as the graduation. The men are then no longer Seniors but are Alumni and take their places on the floor with the Alumni who greet them as such. Pops Concert is at Symphony Hall at the corner of Massachusetts Avenue and Huntington Avenue and starts at 8.15 o'clock. The Glee Club will render several selections and the Senior quartet will sing some of the popular songs of the day. The concert closes with the playing of the Stein Song by the Symphony Orchestra.

A few tickets for seats on the main floor may still be obtained from the ticket office in the main lobby. These seats are for Institute men only. All seats in the balconies which have not been sold by Saturday are to be returned to the box office at Symphony Hall. Men who want tickets after that date may get them at the box office.
