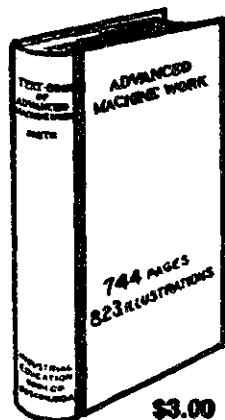
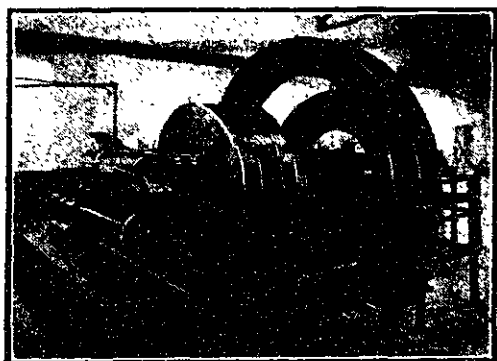

COMMITTEE BEAMS ON HOOVER'S EUROPEANS

Committee that an attempt yesterday afternoon to secure Herbert Hoover to speak at Technology had been unsuccessful. Young had hoped that Technology could be the scene of a banquet on a small scale similar to the recent \$1000 a plate banquet in New York recently.

Irving D. Jakobson '21, chairman of the committee investigating the distribution of Tech Night tickets, read the report of that committee. The report would limit to the number of tickets to five to each purchaser, all of the five to be in one class section. A general sale of tickets is advised in preference to the distribution by letter application which the committee thought too expensive. The report recommended the election of the Tech Night committee before the close of school in June so that the chairman would have time to make his plans.

W. R. Barker '21, chairman of the committee on the intercollegiate conference announced the date of the conference as April 15 and 16. Princeton, Cornell, Pennsylvania, Dartmouth, and Technology are represented on the executive committee. Forty-one colleges are to be invited to send four representatives each to the conference. The discussion will be divided into four parts, student governing bodies, athletics, publications, and dramatics and musical clubs. A total of \$950 has been obtained by the committee to defray the expenses of the conference, \$200 coming from the Institute Committee and \$750 from the Alumni.

The bulletin board committee requested activities to confine themselves to one poster on the boards. The electoral Technique electoral committee constitution was changed to permit the election to the board of an associate editor who will have charge of cuts. Minor changes in the method of balloting on the committee were made.

REDUCED ADMISSIONS FOR T. A. C. MEMBERS

by the inception of basketball as a sport, saying that for the T. A. C. to keep its promise to its members and admit them free to the games of this newly organized branch of athletics would mean financial ruin to the club. The club's budget, he said, had been apportioned before basketball was

recognized and its inauguration meant an additional outlay which the club could not afford unless the members of the club would permit themselves to be taxed a small fee for admission to basketball games. The fee will be a reduced one for T. A. C. members.

J. C. Willson '23, secretary of the M. I. T. A. A. and manager of the Institute gym team, made the motion permitting the T. A. C. to charge reduced prices to basketball games. L. W. Conant '21 amended the motion to provide for financial protection for the T. A. C. in the event of any other sport being recognized before the end of the school year. The amendment was specifically to cover the case of baseball which has been mentioned as a possibility for a varsity sport in the spring.

Lyall L. Stewart, chairman of the arrangements committee of the T. A. C., announced that basketball tickets would be sold at reduced prices only to holders of T. A. C. cards and that such cards would be punched when the holder purchased a ticket to prevent the use of one card for the purchase of more than one ticket. He added that at such meets and athletic contests where the T. A. C. card is all that is necessary for admission, the card must be brought and the explanation by a student that he left it at home will not serve as a substitute.

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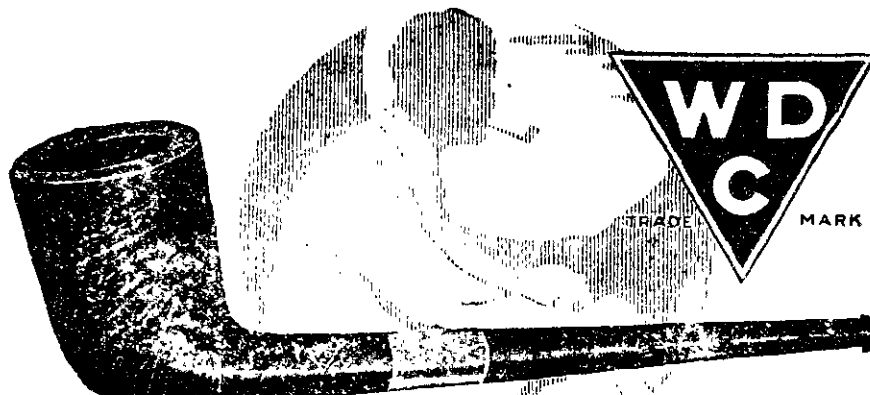
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SOPHS PLAN DANCE
