Technology Will Send Men to 36th Annual Student Conference on Lake George in the Adirondacks June 24

T. C. A. SENDS LETTERS TO LOCAL STUDENTS

Technology will again be represented at the international Student Conference which will be held this year at Silver Bay, on Lake George, from June 24 till July 3. The Technology Christian Association expects to create enough interest in the conference that the institute may be well represented.

In order to arouse enthusiasm for the project, the T. C. A. is arranging to have letters sent out tomorrow to the various fraternities by R. S. Mahaffy '22, as well as notes to about 200 foreign and 300 American students at Technology. The conference last year was attended by over 850 men, and this year the colleges are reporting even larger registration.

NEW BIOLOGY COURSE TO MAKE WIDE APPEAL

Will Combine Three Courses to Help Fill Acute Need

Three Institute courses will be combined to comprise a new biology course to be called the Industrial Biology Option to begin next fall.

There has been, for some time, a need in the industry for men who could apply biology to food and fisheries problems of the modern scale and also to be able to understand, as well, the engineering of biology. In order to fill this demand for such technically trained men and to fit these men for administrative positions in the various food industries such as the packing, canning, fisheries and many other allied industries, work in courses II, XV and VII will be combined to form this new option in VII.

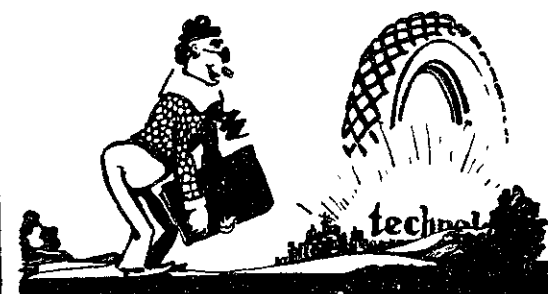
This course has been instituted partly at the request of interests which will be able to use such men as are trained in this work, and the work has been given the active support of the Bureau of Fisheries who will give material assistance in practical advice and use of their apparatus and instructors.

At the end of the freshman year of this option the courses in qualitative and quantitative analysis are taken, as in the regular biology courses. In the second year besides the mathematics, English, Physics and Mechanism courses are given general biology courses, two administration courses and two specialized subjects, fisheries, canning, packing, etc., besides organic chemistry. The third year continues these balanced courses with several engineering subjects as heat engineering and water supplies, several administration courses and specialized and general biology subjects. The last year is a completion of the subjects with a rounding out of the engineering phases of the work in a specializing of the work to be pursued.

Freshman Advisors for Next Year are asked to meet with Dean Burton Thursday at 1:15 o'clock in room 10-250.

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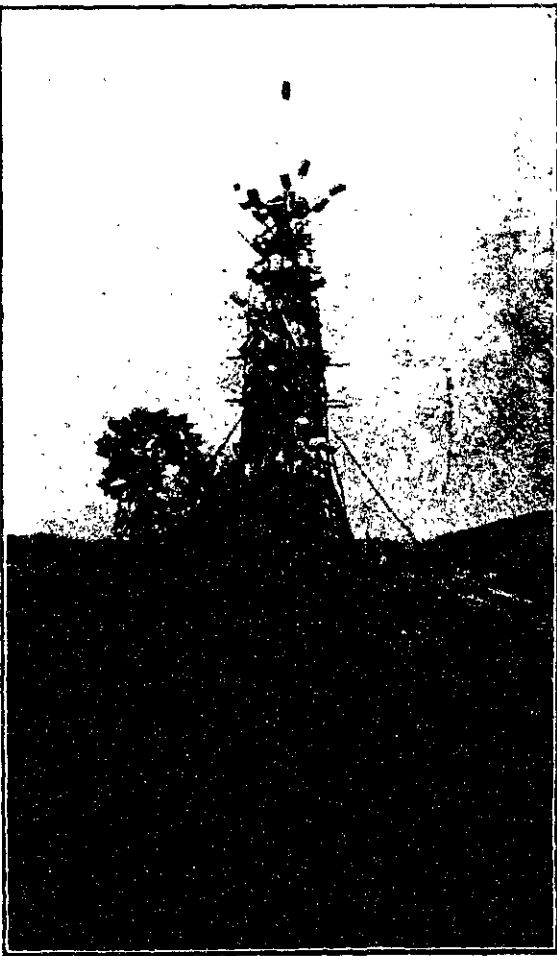
