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RIFLE TEAM SHOOTS AGAINST CAMBRIDGE

Match Will Be the Second Inter-collegiate International Rifle Meet to Be Run Off

RESULTS WILL BE CABLED

Final arrangements have been completed for the rifle match with Cambridge University of England, which is to be shot off on the ninth of June. This will be of considerable interest to collegiate rifle teams, as it is only the second such international inter-collegiate meet to be held, the other being between Yale and Oxford. The results of the match will be cabled as soon as possible to the opposing team.

Ten men will shoot for Technology and the same number for Cambridge, using a small bore gun and a fifty foot indoor range. Targets are being supplied by Cambridge. The requirements state that a competent army officer shall act as judge for each side, and it is believed that one of the officers in the Military Science Department will judge for the Institute.

Turn in Five Wins

Very little information is obtainable as to the strength of the Cambridge team and while close shooting is to be expected, the record of the Engineers for the season has been excellent. Out of nine matches, only three have been lost, one was tied, and five were won. Phil Johnson and several others have been consistently shooting above 98, and some have shot perfect scores twice in succession.

The first match of the season against Worcester Polytech. and lost, due partly to the lack of practice. In the next match, the team apparently tied with Drexel Institute, but a revision of the scores later by N.R.A. judges took a point off the opponents score and left the Beavers one point to the good. Dartmouth won their match by a two point margin, outclassing our team in marksmanship, but a week later Princeton went down to defeat by the overwhelming score of 498 to 479. Harvard was beaten by a wide margin. In the match against Columbia there was some dispute as to conditions, and it was decided finally to call the score a tie at 495. In the practice match with Boston Rifle and Revolver Club, Technology took a defeat by two points.

Freshmen Take All

The freshman team shot only three regular matches besides the N.R.A. matches, winning all three, two by shooting and one by forfeit.

According to Manager Hall the prospects for the next season are very bright as only two men on the team will be graduated this year, and the material in this year's freshman aggregation was very promising. With the new range running in a number one order, and everything ready to start next year without delay there is every reason to believe we have the makings of a champion team.

YALE TENNIS TEAM WINS FROM BEAVER

In the final meet of the season, Technology lost to Yale's tennis team 5-1 at Longwood Monday afternoon. It was the work of Scott and Cauldwell that prevented Adams and Vaughan from making the blue's victory complete.

Yale's star man, Lucian Williams was playing at his best, while Herm Brookmann was not up to standard and lost his singles match with only three games to his credit. Bill Cauldwell, however, was playing well and had his opponent at match point three times in the third set, which he finally lost after 26 games. The rest of the matches went to Yale in two sets apiece.

Coach Rice, whose disinterested work has meant so much to the success of the team this year, may be able to coach again next year. It will be of almost inestimable value if the services of this amateur star can be had again. At present he is working for the Church Cup team, which he expects to play on this summer.
