Varsity Run at Syracuse Meet Still Uncertain

YEARLING HARRIERS FAST

The freshman cross-country team this year is one of the strongest frosh teams in the history of cross-country at Technology, according to Coach Kanaly. Last Friday, when they met Harvard, they showed their metal by taking the first five places, four of them in faster time than the meet was won in last year, and the fifth but a few seconds later.

Harvard was not a very exacting test, however, and the yearlings will have a better chance to show their worth when they run against Worcester Academy Saturday.

Syracuse Meet Doubtful

The varsity squad is still in doubt as to whether they will attend the Syracuse invitation Cross-Country Run. The acceptance to the invitation was sent out late but Syracuse should be heard from today.

Both freshman and varsity took a hard workout on the Belmont course yesterday afternoon and everybody seems in good shape for the meet Saturday. After this Saturday there are but two weeks of cross-country running left, the varsity running in the New Englands at Franklin Park on November 5 and the I. C. A. A. A. run at Van Courtland Park, New York, on November 12.

SOCCER ELEVENS KEEP BUSY

A squad of 25 soccer men has kept the half of Tech Field assigned to the sport busy so far this week. Captain Atahualpa sends his backs against the forwards for a stiff workout each afternoon. The weakness in shooting displayed against Dartmouth last week promises to be less in evidence against Harvard Saturday. The game with the Crimson will be staged before the Harvard-Centre football clash.

Atahualpa reports his eleven very little discouraged by the 1-0 defeat meted out by Dartmouth. The team is in better physical condition than was expected. Technology had no difficulty in securing the ball and taking it down the field. The forward line showed the effect of very little shooting practice and in spite of many opportunities couldn't score.

The frosh outfit returned from Andover quite well pleased with the 1-1 result. Until late last week the soccer elevens had no space for practice. Now an arrangement has been made awarding Manager Hoffman's organization half the gridiron. With this chance for increased work the freshman warriors seem to be making rapid strides and should develop some fine material.

WRESTLING TEAM NEEDS MEN

Men of all weights are needed for the wrestling team, says H. F. Pike '23, manager of the team. The season starts November 7, and all freshmen who intend to substitute wrestling for physical training must sign up with Mr. Kanaly before November 3.

The teams will be coached by Cyclone Burns, the noted wrestler. He will also give lessons in wrestling. A good schedule of contests is being drawn up.

The competition for Freshman Assistant Manager is still open.

FIELD DAY CREWS TRAINING

Two regular crews have been made up of the freshmen candidates. The more experienced and promising men have been put in the first crew, while the others make up the second freshmen crew. Both the freshmen crews have now hit their stride and appear to be in good condition. The first freshmen crew presents a well-trained crew for this time of the season, and by Field Day they should be working smoothly. The second freshman is showing good form and there is a chance that several changes may be made in the make-up of the two crews.

The Sophomores also have two crews out every day. The first crew is made up of the men who rowed as freshmen in the Field Day race last year. This crew shows the results of last year's training and because of this is a slight favorite at the present time.

'24 FIELD DAY ELEVEN REGAINS CRIPPLED BACKS

When Harry Ferguson, regular Sophomore fullback, reported for practice on Monday afternoon after an absence of a week and a half, as well as a half-dozen new candidates, the '24 football squad went through a very lively practice. Benny Lehan was also on deck and said he expected to start work on Thursday. The only cloud on the Sophomore football horizon now is the loss of left guard Leon Levi, who has a broken finger.

This afternoon '24 scrimmages the Huntington School team on Tech Field. Tomorrow a Senior eleven will race Coach Woodruff's organization and fully as much excitement is looked for as was furnished by the Junior-freshman tilt last week.

'24 Squad Now in Good Shape

Lehan will begin practice this week but will not play in the Lowell Institute game making his first appearance on Field Day. The team is in better physical condition than it has been for the last two weeks and the coaches are confident that Lowell will be pushed to the limit on Saturday. The game is to be played at Lowell.

The frosh squad is scrimmaging each afternoon. Coach Metcalfe usually takes part in the battle and reports both attack and defense in good shape. Particular care is being given to the handling of the ball and this weak spot will probably vanish before November 4. Johnston, quarterback, who scored the three point goal against Tufts, booted the pigskin through the bars again yesterday from the 30 yard line at one side of the field.

Unless Andover proves particularly tough the '25 eleven will enter the Field Day test with every man available. The game with Andover will be played at the Academy on Saturday.
