"NO NEAR EAST QUESTION," BELIEVES REV. RIHBANY

Peace Conference Delegate Reveals
Avarice of Nations

"Diplomatic double-dealing" was the sum of the attitude of the great powers to Syrian national aspirations, given by Dr. A. H. Rihbany at a Menorah Society smoker held Wednesday evening.

Being a delegate to the Peace Conference and representing the Syrians in America, Dr. Rihbany explained in detail how he strove vainly to interest the great powers in his cause for an independent and sovereign Syria.

His attempt was futile for the reason that the great powers, especially France, wished to secure a foothold in the Near East and so possibly control the trade and economic development of that region. France, many times promising a delegation to Syria in order to investigate whether the country wished to be free, just as many times refused to send it. He added that the decision of such a delegation would not be accepted anyway.

Jewish Nation Not Feasible

"There is no Near Eastern Question," asserted Rev. Rihbany. "The only point about it is that the great nations wish to divide the Near East between themselves and the Near East does not wish to be divided." He also expressed sympathy with the aspirations of Zionism and the wish of many Jews to establish a Jewish nation in Palestine, although he believed that the plan was not feasible.

He, however, offered a plan whereby the five provinces of Syria, of which Palestine is one, should combine into a federation of states such as the United States, preferably under an American mandate.

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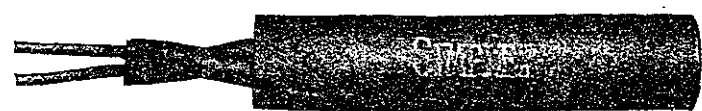
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
