

## DECEMBER T.E.N. HAS TWO FEATURES

### Account of Aldred Lectures to Appear in This Month's Publication

The December issue of the Tech Engineering News appears to-morrow. Two new features have been incorporated in this issue which is the largest ever published. There are fifty two pages which include a two-page picture section.

A new feature which is of particular interest to the underclassmen is an account of the Aldred Lectures. This is the first time that the lectures will be published for the entire student body, and the account includes an introduction of the lecturers and a detailed resume on the first two lectures. There is also a biography of the next lecturer. It is the intended policy of The Tech Engineering News to print the lectures of the preceding month and the biographies of the men to speak the following month.

The picture section is devoted to interesting views of recent developments in the engineering world. Among the shorter articles one of the best is a review of the Imported Automobile Show recently held at New York. C. A. Chayne '19 describes the various motors in a manner which will not fail to attract the interest of motor enthusiasts. Another article of particular note is "Increasing the Efficiency of Gasoline," by Dr. G. Calingaert of the Institute Applied Chemistry Research laboratory. The basis of the story is the method of taking the common "knock" out of gasoline when used in certain high efficiency engines.

An article by the General Superintendent of the New Haven railroad discloses many facts about the existing freight system.

For those who did not have the privilege of personally knowing Richard Cockburn MacLaurin, a picture of the former president of the Institute can be obtained from an article about his part in building Technology.

Many will be interested to learn about the Vail Library in an article written by Miss Lane, the Librarian. The author gives a history of the donor and also a description of the library.

## E. V. HICKY ADDRESSES CORP. XV AT SMOKER

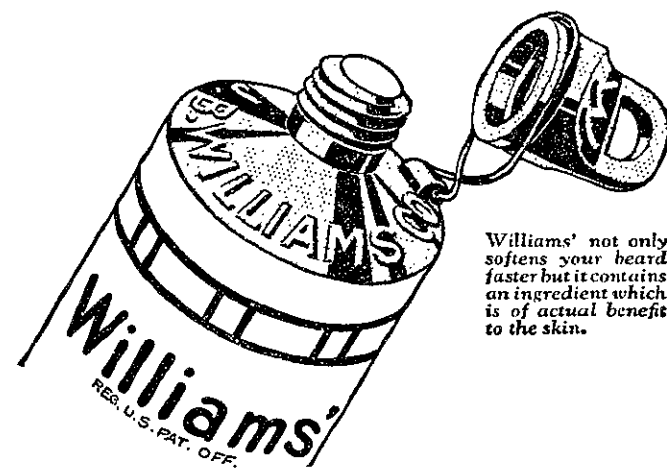
